Yes this is the one at 925 Freeman. When I sampled it I approximated the water level to be around 8-10' bgs. We didn't want to risk cross contamination so we did not stick a probe down it to get the water level or total depth. I let my bailer sink a little in the water and would say its at least 15' deep from what I could tell
