Dear Mr. Culp,

The following information is a follow up from the conversation we had on Monday 1/30/05. The Magellen pipeline was built in the late 1960's and was owned and operated by Kinley until 1998 when it was sold to Magellen (Formerly Williams Pipeline).

The 4" steel carbon welded pipeline was constructed as a single use pipeline for the sole purpose of supplying JP-4 fuel to Offutt A.F.B. For the entire history, JP-4 was the only product shipped through this pipeline and Offutt A.F.B. was the only consumer. The 4" thirteen mile pipeline originates at the Amoco Terminal in Council Bluffs, Iowa and continues directly to Offutt A.F.B.

A leak occurred on the 4" pipeline in the mid 1980's and Kinley replaced the pipeline with new pipe which was x-rayed and tested. In the late 1980's, Kinley abandoned the pipeline. Up to present day, the pipeline has not been in use and has been in a dormant state.

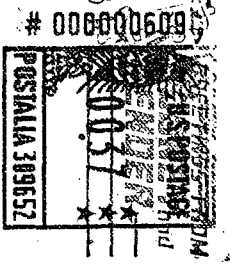
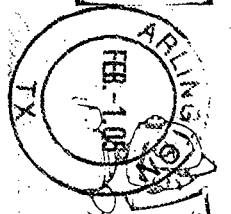
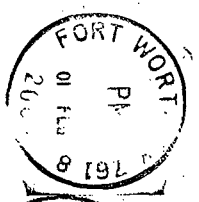
