The Environmental Protection Commission recently updated Iowa Administrative Code Chapter 567-122 Cathode Ray Tube (CRT) device recycling. These rules were adopted to satisfy the requirements of Iowa Code sections 455D.6(7) and 455B.304(1) and to insure that the discarded CRTs are recycled in a manner that is safe for human health and the environment. Our current records show your facility as a registered CRT collector.

The rule update includes the following changes for registered CRT collection facilities:

- **567 122.5(1) and 122.7(1)c** –legal entitlement to store/recycle CRTs on the property.
 CRT registered collection facilities must include proof of the applicant’s ownership of the property or legal entitlement to use the property for CRT collection. If the facility is leased, the application shall also include a statement, signed by the property owner, stating that the property owner is aware that CRT collection is taking place at the site and that the property owner may be held liable for wastes abandoned at the property.
 To satisfy this requirement, a form has been enclosed for your convenience and is also available at the link provided below. Please return this completed form to assure your registered facility is in compliance with the updated rules.
- **567 122.11 –CRT** - Reporting requirements for registered CRT collection facilities.
 CRT collectors must document CRT’s on site January 1, each year and again on December 31, of that same year, and submit the annual report that shows recycling at least 75% each year. The CRT recycling annual report form will be mailed to you about one month prior to its due date before February 1, and is also and is available at: <https://www.iowadnr.gov/Environmental-Protection/Land-Quality/Solid-Waste/Solid-Waste-Permitting#Cathode-Ray-Tubes-CRT-Collection-Recycling-133>.

The first CRT registration annual report will be due by Feb. 1st 2024 that shall include the inventory on January 1, 2023 and December 31, 2023 and include CRT’s sent to a recycler. All CRT registrations will expire on March 1st each year unless an annual report is received and approved.

Summary of requirements:

- Fill out the enclosed CRT registration form and return to the DNR as stated below.
- Document the inventory of CRTs on site January 1st 2023 and then again on December 31 2023. Keep documentation on all CRTs transferred to a CRT recycling facility. The annual report requiring this information will be due by February 1, 2024.
