IX. General Provisions

The above-named permitted agency is hereby authorized to operate a solid waste citizen convenience center (CCC) at the described location in conformance with Iowa Code section 455B, the rules pursuant thereto existing at the time of issuance, and any subsequent new rules which may be duly adopted, and any provisions contained in Section X of this permit.

The project shall be constructed and operated according to the engineering plans and specifications, the site operation plan approved by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR), and these shall become a part of this permit. Updated plans shall be submitted at the time of each permit renewal and included with any request for permit modification or significant changes in facility operation.

No legal or financial responsibility arising from the construction or operation of the approved project shall attach to the State of Iowa or the DNR due to the issuance of this permit. If title to this project is transferred, the new owner must apply to the DNR for a transfer of this permit within thirty (30) days of the date of title transfer. This permit is void sixty (60) days after the date of title transfer unless the DNR has transferred the permit.

The permit holder is required to maintain records for the service area of tonnages accepted at this facility in accordance with Iowa Administrative Code (IAC) 567 Chapter 106.6(455B,455D), only if the facility directly disposes of solid waste outside Iowa. Records shall be developed and maintained in such a way that tonnages from each county/state may be tracked in order to provide the local solid waste agency and the DNR with accurate statistics from which generation and diversion rates will be derived. The reports are due on a quarterly basis and shall be submitted to the DNR using Form #542-8025. The reports will be due January 1st, April 1st, July 1st and October 1st for the quarters ending September 30th, December 31st, March 31st and June 30th, respectively. The permit holder shall submit the completed form to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources; Solid Waste & Contaminated Sites section; 6200 Park Avenue; Suite 200; Des Moines, Iowa 50321. This reporting procedure supersedes any previous conflicting permit provisions.

The permit holder shall provide continuous financial assurance coverage for site closure in accordance with 567 IAC Chapter 106.18(455B). The permit holder shall submit proof of compliance, including an updated closure cost estimate and proof of coverage with each permit renewal, until released from this requirement by the DNR.

Solid waste accepted at this site shall not exhibit free liquids, toxic or hazardous properties. No hazardous wastes as defined by Iowa Code section 455B.411 may be accepted at this facility.

Failure to comply with Iowa Code section 455B, or any rule of order promulgated pursuant thereto, or any or all provisions of this permit may result in: 1) a civil penalty of up to \$5,000 for each day of violation, pursuant to Iowa Code section 455B.307, or 2) the suspension or revocation of this permit, pursuant to Iowa Code section 455B.305.

The issuance of this permit in no way relieves the applicant of the responsibility for complying with all other local, state, and federal statutes, ordinances, and rules or other requirements applicable to the establishment and operation of this solid waste citizen convenience center.

X. Special Provisions

1. The permit holder is authorized to accept up to 360 tons of municipal solid waste annually in accordance with the approved Great River Regional Waste Authority's (GRRWA) updated Solid Waste Comprehensive Plan (Plan). The Plan as approved by the DNR on February 25, 2022 (Environmental Management System "EMS"), any approved amendments to the Plan, and the latest Plan update are hereby incorporated as permit documents.

The permitted service area is described as: The unincorporated area of Henry County.

Collected waste shall be disposed of at the Great River Regional Waste Authority's Sanitary Landfill (Permit #56-SDP-07-80P) located in Fort Madison, IA. The permit holder is not authorized to transfer any solid waste to any other sanitary disposal project in Iowa without first receiving DNR approval.

2. No provision in this permit or the approved site operation plan, emergency response and remedial action plan, and closure plan, as described in the permit renewal application received January 21, 2025 (Doc #111910), constitutes a waiver from 567 IAC Chapter 106 or the Code of Iowa. Any conflict between a provision of the permit or referenced documents and Iowa rules or statutes shall be resolved in favor of the duly adopted rules and statutes.
