### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

# <u>Summary of Modifications to the approved Plans and Specifications:</u>

A completed IDNR Permit Application Form 50B is included as Attachment A.

General site mapping was included in the 2010 Permit Renewal Documentation (Doc #58394) and is still applicable.

The property where the transfer station is located is leased from Jones County. The lease gives access to the property until January 1, 2045. The lease agreement was included in the 2010 Permit Renewal Documentation (Doc #58394) and is still applicable.

An updated Organizational Chart is included as Attachment B. Note that the chair of the Commission may change during the permit cycle. The current chair of the Jones County Solid Waste Management Commission is Russ Benke.

Since the facility is permitted for less than 20,000 tons per year, operator certification is not required.

The current scale license (expires 12/31/2025) from IDALS is included as Attachment C.

A Site Design Plan, including plan layouts of the transfer station building, was included in the 2010 Permit Renewal Documentation (Doc #58394) and is still applicable with the exception of Section 106.10(2)b. The scale to the south is no longer used – the scale that is used is located immediately west of the transfer station building.

The Site Operation Plan submitted in the 2010 Permit Renewal Documentation (Doc #58394) is still applicable.

The updated Emergency Response and Remedial Action Plan (ERRAP) submitted in the 2022 Permit Renewal Documentation (Doc #103406) is still applicable.

The Closure Plan submitted in the 2010 Permit Renewal Documentation (Doc #58394) is still applicable.

The updated Closure Cost Estimate for the Transfer Station is \$21,550. The Closure Cost Estimate certified by an Iowa licensed Professional Engineer is included as Attachment D. A resolution designating the Establishment of the Transfer Station Closure Account is included as Attachment E. The balance of the closure account as of April 30, 2025 is \$22,431.50 (Attachment F). The amount reserved for closure of the transfer station is greater than the estimated closure cost of the transfer station.

The Jones County Solid Waste Management Commission operates a satellite temporary storage center for collection of eligible household hazardous material (HHM). Wastes are transported to the Cedar Rapids Linn County Solid Waste Agency HHM RCC facility for lab packing and transport to a permitted hazardous waste disposal facility.

Jones County Transfer Station 2025 SDP Permit Renewal Executive Summary Permit No. 53-SDP-06-07P-XFR

The building meets the requirements of the RCC.

An updated Operations Plan and an updated Emergency Contingency Plan for the HHM satellite collection site were submitted in the 2022 Permit Renewal Documentation (Doc #103406) and are still applicable.

# **Summary of each Special Provision of the existing SDP Permit:**

- 1. The Transfer Station participates in the East Central Iowa Council of Governments (ECICOG) Comprehensive Plan. The most recent update of the Comprehensive Plan was approved by IDNR on March 7, 2023. The provision should be updated to reflect this date.
- 2. The Site Operation Plan and the Closure Plan submitted in the 2010 Permit Renewal Documentation (Doc #58394) and the updated Emergency Response and Remedial Action Plan submitted in the 2022 Permit Renewal Documentation (Doc #103406) are are still applicable.

# Authority

The following calculations are based on IAC Chapter 567-106.18, <u>Citizen convenience center and transfer station financial assurance</u>.

# **Closure Cost Estimate**

The closure costs are to be estimated based on the activities listed in IAC Chapter 567-106.18(4).

IAC 106.18(4)a Third party labor and transportation costs and total tip fees to properly dispose of all solid waste and litter equal to twice the maximum storage capacity of the facility. Include waste stored on site in transportation vehicles or waste receptacles.

Estimated maximum solid waste storage capacity within the transfer station building based on past closure cost estimates is approximately 100 tons. There are typically three trailers on site that are used for hauling waste to the Millennium Landfill for disposal. Loads are typically 22 tons on average. Therefore, the amount of waste to be considered in the closure cost estimate in accordance with IAC 106.18(4)a is:

$$(100 \text{ tons } *2) + 66 \text{ tons (trailers)} = 266 \text{ tons} = 12 \text{ loads (at 22 tons/load)}$$

Disposal cost at the landfill is \$22.73/ton. Hauling cost is \$460/load. Therefore, cost for waste disposal is:

Cost should be included for disposal of stockpiled recyclable material. The cost of recyclable removal varies greatly with the markets and quantities on site. HHM materials are also accepted at the satellite facility. Since recyclables and HHM are removed throughout the year large quantities do not accumulate on site. The 2022 closure cost estimate used a cost of \$8,270 for recyclable and HHM removal. Increase this estimate by 5% for this analysis.

Assume it takes a two person crew 2 days to clean the transfer station building and equipment. Assume costs are \$500/day and that cost includes supplies and equipment. Therefore, cost is:

$$(\$500/\text{day} * 2 \text{ days}) =$$
