

Dear Mr. Delaney,

This letter is to inform you that the Planning & Zoning Commission denied your request to rezone your property located at 120 Thomas Street SE, Cascade from C-1 to M-1 on May 9, 2019 and the City Council upheld that denial at the May 13, 2019 City Council meeting. As such, the property located at 120 Thomas Street SE, Parcel Identification 1931435008, will remain zoned C-1. Pursuant to the City's ordinances and the Court's prior orders regarding the property, you must refrain from processing, which includes recycling tires, at this location.

At this point, if you wish to continue your tire processing operations, the business will need to be relocated to a new location. As suggested at the May 13, 2019 City Council meeting by several Council Members, the Cascade Economic Development Corporation might be able to assist you in finding a better location for your business.

Finally, as you acknowledged at the May 9, 2019 Planning and Zoning Commission meeting and the May 13, 2019 City Council meeting, your property at 120 Thomas Street is not in compliance with the City Code. Currently there are several tires visible above the fence and in addition to a large quantity of tires visibly scattered around the property. As you know, this violates City Ordinance 51.02 as it is the storage, accumulation, and presence of old or discarded rubber on your property. At the City Council Meeting, it is my recollection that you stated you could have your property "cleaned up" in six weeks. The City will provide you with sixty (60) days from the date of this letter to get the property into compliance with the City Code. If the property is not cleaned up within sixty (60) days, the City will take other action available to it under the law.

Additionally, for your convenience I have included a copy of the correct zoning map, which shows the lot to the south owned by you zoned residential.

## May 13, 2019 City Council Meeting Minutes

The May 13, 2019 Regular City Council meeting was called to order at 6:00PM by Mayor Staner. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and then Hosch, Kelchen, Rausch, Knepper and Delaney answered roll call.

A motion was made by Kelchen, second by Rausch to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Shirley McDermott inquired about what happened at the corner of Tyler Street NE and 1st Ave E. Also, Nicole & Nate Meyer asked if there had been any discussion on options for assisting them with their building improvement. The City Administrator will be in touch in the next week or so. Ralph Delaney addressed the City Council and asked what the City Administrator does and who controls her. According to him, in court he thought she said that she runs the P&Z commission and the City Council. He also wanted to know if the Council was aware of the lawsuits. They Mayor commented that she reports to him and that the entire council knew about all the lawsuits. He also discussed the storm sewer runoff coming from the townhouses adjacent to their business. Jason Delaney also approached the council and said that mud is running onto their property and it will soon wash away their fence. This was looked at and will again be reviewed.

Council reviewed the items in the consent agenda including City Council minutes and workshop minutes 04/22/19, Park Board minutes 05/06/19, Planning & Zoning minutes 05/09/19, May claims for payment and April financial reports and fund balances and revenue by fund as follows: General \$ 317,831.27, Special Revenues \$170,457.41, Debt Service \$20,130.29, Enterprise \$96,891.14. Motion by Kelchen, second by Delaney to approve the items in the consent agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

Council reviewed **Resolution #26-19**, Resolution Approving Bond Purchase Agreement for the Sale of Bonds. This bond is for \$2M for the pool project that was approved by the public in May 2018. The interest rates on this bond is lower than we had reviewed in January. Motion by Delaney, second by Hosch to approve **Resolution #26-19**. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

It was now time for the public hearing on the zoning classification amendment request from C-1 Highway Commercial to M-1 Light Industrial for Delaney Auto & Ag. Motion by Kelchen, second by Rausch to open the public hearing at 6:10p.m. Motion carried unanimously. Ralph Delaney said they are requesting their zoning to be changed from C-1 to M-1 so they can shred tires. If allowed to shred the tires, there would be no tires at the business. There have been no verbal or written complaints about their business. The City is holding them up. Delaney feels that they are recycling not processing. The houses were built around the business. The area has been C-1 for 40 years. Alan Knepper addressed the Council. He owns vacant lots that are adjacent to the business. Ralph and Jason Delaney are neighbors. They are hard workers. They have had property appraisals done and a prospective buyer and the comment from all of that is, "What's over there with all the tires". M-1 zoning request is not just for the current building, but for more of their lots, thus expanding their business. There are other M-1 land and building opportunities that they could relocate to. The City or CEDC could assist them with this move. This has been going on a long time and it needs a permanent fix, not just a band aid. Jason Delaney addressed the City Council. There is a wood pile next to his building and it has been there a long time. It would only take 6 weeks to get rid of the tires. He can get 600 tons of tire shredding sold to Scott County. The future is seeing tires being processed into new tires. The DNR has requirements to operate his business. He has another hoop building that he will put behind so the tires would all be inside. The zoning map he has shows that the one lot is also C-1 and not residential. The City Administrator commented that the map was incorrect. He also asked if they could start using their existing hoop building for the tire business. At this time Mayor

Staner asked if there were anymore comments from the public. Being none, motion by Kelchen, second by Rausch at 6:32p.m. Motion carried unanimously.

Mayor Staner commented that he has no problem with what they are doing and that there is a need for this. The problem is that the 1<sup>st</sup> year they were asked to cleanup and nothing happened. It is not fair for the area. The P&Z voted it down and the neighbors all talked at the meeting. Council Member Kelchen commented that he watched the P&Z meeting and that they have worked on cleaning up spot zoning so we shouldn't encourage more of this. Council Member Delaney commented that the tire business should be moved since this is not a good spot for it. Delaney should talk to CEDC about a different location for the business. Council Member Rausch commented that their business is a huge asset to the community, but the location is not good. Council Member Knepper commented that there is a better location for this. CEDC would probably be glad to assist. Council Member Hosch commented that he has heard complaints from neighbors and it is a bad policy to change to M-1.

Council reviewed the 1<sup>st</sup> Reading of **Ordinance #05-19**. Motion by Delaney, second by Kelchen to leave the zoning as C-1. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote. **Ordinance #5-19 fails**.

Council reviewed **Resolution #31-19**, Resolution Making Award of Construction Contract for the Cascade Municipal Swimming Pool Project. The low bidders for the pool project were Ricchio, Inc. for contract #1 and #2 for a total of \$1,700,000 and Beck Construction for Contract #3 for a total of \$1,030,962. Motion by Kelchen, second by Delaney to approve **Resolution 31-19**. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Council reviewed **Resolution #27-19**, Resolution Setting a Date of Meeting at Which it is Proposed to Approve a Development Agreement with Cheryl and Joel Wood, Including Annual Appropriation Tax Increment Payments. Motion by Delaney, second by Knepper to approve **Resolution #27-19**. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

Council reviewed **Resolution #28-19**, Resolution Approving Payment in the Amount of \$50,000 to Cheryl's Flour Garden Bakery & Coffee Bar from the Community Catalyst & Remediation Gran Program. Motion by Delaney, second by Kelchen to approve **Resolution #28-19**. Motion carried unanimously by roll call vote.

The Cascade Planning & Zoning Commission met on Thursday, May 9, 2019, at 6:00p.m. in the Cascade City Hall Council Chambers, 320 1st Ave W, Cascade, IA 52033. Present for the meeting and answering roll were: Otting, Gehl, Conlin, Kerper, Steffen, Sauser and Moriarity.

A motion was made by Conlin, which was seconded by Steffen to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Otting, which was seconded by Steffen to approve the meeting minutes from April 4, 2019. Motion carried unanimously.

It was time to hold the public hearing on the proposed amendment to the zoning ordinance. C-1, Highway Commercial District to M-1, Light Industrial District for Delaney Auto & Ag. Motion by Moriarity, second by Conlin to open the public hearing at 6:01pm. Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Gehl asked if anyone present wanted to comment on the rezoning request. Ralph Delaney of Delaney Auto & Ag addressed the Commission. We just want to be able to get rid of the tires. We have a place that wants as much as we can give them as fast as we can get it to them. Everything we are doing except the shredding can be done in C-1.

Terry Fischer, neighbor to the property opposes the rezoning. If the zoning gets changed it will be the biggest tire recycling location in Iowa.

Alan Knepper, neighbor to the property. They share a common street with Delaney's. So Delaney is actually wanting to expand the business since they are requesting M-1 for all the lots except what is residential. A decision has to be made, stop putting band aids on the problem. There are other areas zoned M-1, they could move there. Ralph Delaney commented that they thought it would help their case since the Webber building is zoned M-1.

Kevin Meier, adjacent to the lots to be rezoned. Our property is residential and when we bought our house, we were told that the property to the north was zoned C-1 and would never change. The value of our property has dropped. It's loud and not fair to property owners.

Bob Moriarity, taxpayers spent over \$1M to develop an industrial park. City should give Delaney an incentive to move into the Industrial Park.

David Hawkins, neighbor to Delaney's. He supports what Alan Knepper suggested. Find a solution and finish this.

Ralph Delaney, when they first started their business it was considered the old industrial park. The DNR will patrol what they do. We want to work with the P&Z and City. We just want to get it cleaned up. They would like to put the machine in the hoop building.

Vickie Fischer, neighbor to Delaney's. She showed the commission a picture of what they see when they pull up their driveway. A picture of Delaney's business.

Jason Delaney addressed the Commission. Everything we do is noisy. Machine is quiet. We can be open 24 hours a day and make noise if we want.

Kevin Meier, he doesn't mind the machine running during the day, but machines run late at night.

Mike Beck, property owner next to Delaney's. It never gets cleaned up. M-1 shouldn't be next to residential. Again, the property never gets cleaned up.

Mayor Greg Staner, this all has been going on for 2-3 years. The City of Cascade will continue to enforce our ordinances. Just this past week we sent out 4 notices to people. The City doesn't have a problem with the business, just they way it is being done.

With no further comments from the public, motion by Moriarity, second by Steffen to close the public hearing at 6:30pm. Motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Gehl asked each commission member thoughts on rezoning. Conlin, don't like M-1 next to residential. Sauser, side with the neighbors. Moriarity, solution at City Council, Steffen, didn't clean it up before this meeting, Kerper, not in favor of spot zoning. Motion by Conlin to disapprove the zoning request from C-1 to M-1, second by Sauser. Motion passes unanimously by roll call vote.

This will go before the City Council, Monday, May 13th at 6:00pm.

With no other business, a motion was made by Steffen, which was seconded by Moriarty, to adjourn at 6:45 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.

ORDER

The matter came before the court for trial on March 16, 2018 and June 15, 2018. Plaintiff was represented by attorney Holly Corkery and Deanna McCusker, Cascade City Administrator, appeared personally as representative for Plaintiff. Jason Delaney appeared personally for Defendant and was represented by attorney Erich Preibe.

The civil infraction was filed by the City of Cascade against Delaney's Auto & Ag Center & Repair, Inc./J&R Recycling. The City of Cascade ("Cascade") alleges that Defendant Delaney ("Delaney") violated the city zoning code by operating a tire recycling and process business that is exceeds what the property is zoned for which is C-1 (commercial).

Delaney's is located at 120 Thomas Street, SE, Cascade, lowa. It is an auto and ag repair shop.

Cascade City Administrator Deanna McCusker and Cascade Police Chief Fred Heim testified for Plaintiff. Mel Pins from the Iowa Department of Natural Resources also testified for Plaintiff. Carol Recker, office manager for Delaney's, testified for Defendant.

The court notes that in a prior court order dated April 21, 2017, Defendant was ordered to appear before the City of Cascade Zoning Board (case no. CACICV10558). Defendant did not appear in front of the City of Cascade Zoning Board and the City did not file a motion to compel Defendant to do so.

Ms. McCusker testified that Delaney was engaged in tire recycling and processing and that exceeded the C-1 zoning designation. The C-1 (highway commercial district) allows for use of automobile sales, service and repair including farm implements. City of Cascade Ordinance 165 (Exhibit Y). Delaney was issued a waste tire recycling permit by the DNR. (Exhibit B). The permit was issued on December 10, 2015 and expired on December 10, 2018. Mr. Pins testified that Delaney had been issued a permit to recycle old tires. The City of Cascade maintains that recycling the old tires

(shredding the tires) is manufacturing because it is processing the tires and turning them into a new product.

McCusker testified that the tire recycling and tire processing business would fall under a M-1 light industrial zoning designation. The M-1 designation is intended for manufacturing, processing, storage, wholesaling and distribution. (See City of Cascade Ordinance 165).

McCusker and Chief Heim testified that there was large quantity of tires that Delaney appeared to be processing. Further, there was a tire processing machine on the property. Along with the zoning issue, the City had long been warning Delaney that items on the property constituted a nuisance. The Court acknowledges that the City had been warning Delaney for months and months to clean up the property and to apply to be re-zoned. The parties had even agreed that Delaney would meet with the zoning board and Defendant failed to do so.

Carol Recker testified for Defendant. Ms. Recker offered two checks that Delaney received for the shredded rubber (Exhibit BB).

The burden of proof is upon the City of Cascade and standard of proof is by clear, satisfactory and convincing evidence. The City offered proof that Delaney was operating a tire recycling business. Defendant does not deny that it operated such a business along with its auto repair business. The C-1 zoning designation is essentially for retail purposes. The M-1 zoning designation is for manufacturing, processing and wholesaling. The crux of the case is whether or not recycling old tires and shredding them for the purpose of selling the shredded tires is manufacturing or processing. The Court does not find that Delaney was manufacturing. The Court finds that was engaged processing by recycling tires. Process (verb) is defined as performing a series of mechanic or chemical operations in order to change or preserve it. By shredding the tires, Delaney was mechanically changing the physical make-up of the tires in order to preserve them. The Court finds that Delaney was not manufacturing a new product. The Court finds that Delaney was processing the materials and that exceeded the C-1 zoning designation. By recycling tires Delaney was processing the tires and that activity exceeds the commercial zoning designation. The C-1 zoning designation does not allow for processing. The City of Cascade met its burden proof in proving the zoning violation.

The City requested a civil penalty in the amount of \$250.00 per day that Delaney was not in compliance with the city zoning code. Plaintiff requests a daily \$250.00 penalty from April 17, 2017 to the date of trial. The photos presented at trial show Delaney was in not in compliance with the zoning code at least six times. Defendant presented checks showing payment for shredded tires only on two occasions. The Court is not convinced that Delaney was in violation of the zoning ordinance each day from April 2017 until the time of trial in May 2018. Neither is the Court convinced that Delaney was only in violation of the code on two occasions. The Court assesses a civil penalty in the amount of \$5,000.00. Delaney shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$5,000.00 for being in violation of the City of Cascade zoning ordinance by engaging in tire recycling. Court costs are assessed to Defendant Delaney. The civil penalty and court costs are due on or by February 18, 2019 (thirty days from the date of this order).

Plaintiff requested that the Court order Delaney to come into compliance with the zoning ordinance if Delaney continues to engage in tire recycling. If Delaney continues to operate a tire recycling business by shredding old tires then Delaney shall go through the proper process with the City of Cascade to be re-zoned to the appropriate designation to operate said business.
