The Iowa Master Gardener program is offering a webinar session titled, "Identification and Management of Invasive Woody Plants in Iowa" 6:30 - 8:30 PM Tuesday, June 28 at Heartland Acres Agribition Center Theater, 2066 Swan Lake Blvd, Independence. Cost is \$5 per session for the general public and \$2 per session for Master Gardeners.

This session will include a discussion of notorious invasive woody plants, their potential impacts, and the life history characteristics of woody plants that increase the likelihood of their invasiveness. In addition, there will be discussion on how a specific invasive plant (common buckthorn) contributes to the establishment of other invasive pests, and a citizen-scientist project that participants can join to help manage buckthorn. Two presenters from Iowa State University, Ian Thompson, Department of Natural Resource Ecology and Management, and Matt O'Neal, Department of Entomology, will conduct this session.

Pork producers who manage or own a sow herd will want to attend an advanced swine breeding herd management seminar in Waverly June 28. The event is sponsored by Iowa State University Extension, Iowa Pork Industry Center and Iowa Pork Producers Association.

Seminar topics will discuss gilt development, impacts of genetic selection, new technologies, disease management, proper semen handling and management and review induced farrowing and oxytocin usage.

Dr. Mark Knauer, swine specialist, National Pork Board, will share how gilt development happens early in their life-cycle which may change how you raise and select your replacement gilts. He will also address how genetic selection impacts reproductive performance.

Dr. Roger Main, DVM, director of operations at ISU Vet Diagnostic Lab, will outline the key factors that influence reproductive health and share management tips with awareness of new technologies that can improve reproductive success.

Nicky Sleezer, director of the Sleezer Fertility Center, will review proper semen handling and management and highlight management needs during hot weather.

Mark Storie, ISU Extension swine field specialist, will review the practice of induced farrowing, proper oxytocin usage and share a study that examines fetal imprinting.

L&M Radiator, Inc. plans to submit a Notice of Intent to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources to be covered under the NPDES General Permit No. 1 "Storm Water Discharge Association with Industrial Activity." General Permit:
The storm water discharge will be from L&M's radiator manufacturing located in NW quarter of Section 10, Township 86 N, Range 9W, Buchanan County.
Storm water will be discharged from four sources and will be discharged off site as the facility drains primarily to the north across agricultural fields, across 3 Elms Park Road and then across private residential property before entering the Wapsipicon River.
